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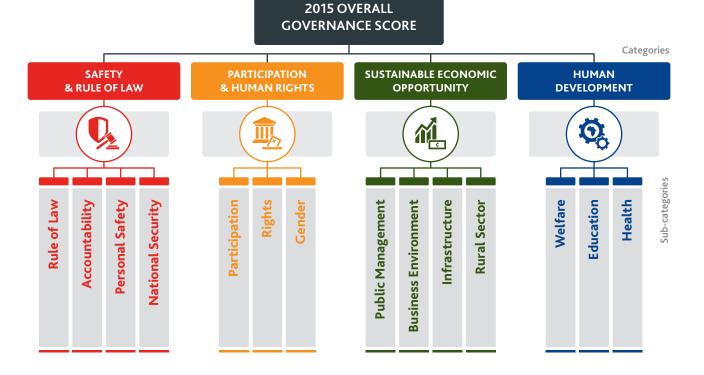
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All figures have been rounded to the nearest one decimal place. This means that countries may appear to have the same score, or the change over time may appear inaccurate, but this is not the case when all decimal places are taken into account. Countries have been ranked and trends have been described on the basis of full scores not the rounded numbers that appear here.

Regional Economic Community (REC) averages are calculated by applying the REC's current membership configuration for all data years.

The Mo Ibrahim Foundation (MIF) is aware that some sources update their data sets after our documentation is sent to print. IIAG raw data are correct as per the date 'last accessed', which is stated for each indicator within the Data Portal (www.moibrahimfoundation.org/iiag/downloads/).

South Sudan and Sudan are excluded from all group averages pre-2011 as neither country existed in their current configurations before the secession of South Sudan in 2011.



The Ibrahim Index of African Governance (IIAG) measures the quality of governance in every African country on an annual basis. It does this by compiling data from diverse global sources to build an accurate and detailed picture of governance performance in African countries.

The broad aim of the IIAG is to better inform and sustain the debate on African governance by providing a transparent and user-friendly resource to:

 support citizens, governments, institutions and the private sector to accurately assess the delivery of public goods and services, and policy outcomes.



• help determine, debate and strengthen government performance.

The IIAG was created in 2007 in recognition of the need for a quantifiable tool to accurately measure and monitor African governance performance, its progress over time and across countries, and as a means of supporting effective and responsive solutions to complex public policy challenges in developing countries. Policies need to be evaluated by their results, which can only be done if accompanied by robust data.

GABON

Since 2011, Gabon shows overall governance improvement, underpinned by gains in three of the four IIAG categories. This leads Gabon to perform well in comparison to its regional peers in Central Africa, while mid-ranking within the continent.

Within each category there is a mixed picture, with Gabon showing either declining, or static, performance in at least one sub-category of each governance dimension.

Overall governance: overall and regular improvement in this mid-ranking country.

Gabon scores 52.2 (out of 100) in overall governance in 2014, ranking just within the top half of the continental list, at 23rd place (out of 54) in Africa. This result places the country as scoring both higher than the African average and higher than the regional average for Central Africa. Gabon achieves its highest overall governance score seen since 2000 in 2014, having achieved its lowest score in 2000, showing year-on-year improvement since 2006. The country displays the second best overall governance in Central Africa, behind São Tomé & Príncipe.

The overall governance gain of +1.2 score points since 2011 places Gabon as the sixteenth most improved on the continent. This overall improvement of +1.2 points is driven by all but one of the underlying categories. *Safety & Rule of Law* (+1.2), *Participation & Human Rights* (+3.6) and *Human Development* (+0.8) all show gains since 2011, whilst *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* registers a slight decline (-0.8).

Safety & Rule of Law: high and improving scores in National Security.

This is Gabon's second best performing category, scoring 57.7, thus leading Gabon to rank 20th on the continent. The underlying sub-categories show a wide range of scores, from 90.0 in *National Security*, Gabon's highest scoring sub-category of the whole IIAG, to 31.8 in *Accountability*, Gabon's lowest scoring sub-category. This range of scores translates into a similarly wide array of ranks, with the country ranking 12th on the continent in *National Security*, but only 32nd in *Accountability*.

This category shows an upward trajectory, having improved by +1.2 score points since 2011. This is underpinned by gains mainly in *National Security* (+5.0) and less so in *Accountability* (+1.0). Meanwhile, the other two sub-categories, *Rule of Law* (-1.1) and *Personal Safety* (-0.3), show deterioration. The indicator *Domestic Armed Conflict* has shown improvement of +25.0 score points since 2011, driving most of the gains in *National Security*, whilst Gabon has made strides in the measure of *Accountability of Public Officials* (+33.3) which is triggering much of the improvement within *Accountability*.

Conversely, Gabon is showing a score drop of -7.9 points in *Property Rights*, the sole driver of deterioration in the subcategory *Rule of Law*, and *Police Services* (-1.6), resulting in the decline in *Personal Safety* score.

Participation & Human Rights: Gabon's most improved category.

Gabon scores 48.6 in *Participation & Human Rights*, ranking 28th on the continent. Within this component, Gabon shows its best sub-category performance in *Gender*, scoring 60.8, and its weakest in *Participation*, scoring 37.0.

The improvement shown in this category (+3.6) is the largest shown by Gabon, as well as the thirteenth biggest on the continent and the largest in Central Africa. Both *Participation* (+2.4) and *Gender* (+9.1) contribute to this upward trajectory, although a slight downturn in *Rights* in recent years (-0.8) has tempered otherwise larger improvements in the category.

Within the seven indicators of the *Gender* sub-category, Gabon displays improvement in four of them: *Gender Equality in the Workplace* (+33.3), *Women in Politics* (+12.5), *Legislation on Violence against Women* (+8.3) and *Women's*

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Participation in the Labour Force (+0.7). The more modest gains in *Participation* have been driven entirely by the measure of *Political Participation* (+7.1) with no change in the two other indicators for which there are data for Gabon.

The most negative performance within *Participation & Human Rights* appears within *Rights*, with a drop of -12.5 points in *Freedom of Association & Assembly*.

Sustainable Economic Opportunity: both lowest scoring and declining.

Gabon scores 41.2 in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity*, ranking 31st on the continent. This is the lowest of Gabon's category results, reached through rather modest scores in all four underlying sub-categories: *Public Management* (43.3), *Business Environment* (45.0), *Infrastructure* (37.7) and *Rural Sector* (39.0). The country's highest sub-category rank placement in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* is seen in *Infrastructure* (24th).

Sustainable Economic Opportunity is the only category in which Gabon registers a score deterioration since 2011, in line with the average continental trend. Gabon's fall in score is underpinned by both *Public Management* (-3.0) and *Rural Sector* (-2.6). The main drivers of these downward trajectories are the indicators *Ratio of Total Revenue to Total Expenditure* (-19.3) and *Agricultural Policy Costs* (-21.1).

Meanwhile, Gabon shows some notable indicator-level improvements in *Business Environment* and *Infrastructure*, the two sub-categories in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* in which the country improves between 2011 and 2014, by +1.0 and +1.4 respectively. The largest positive indicator trends of these sub-categories can be seen in the measures of *Investment Climate* (+11.1) and *Digital Connectivity* (+11.5).

Human Development: Gabon's highest scoring category shows gains.

Gabon scores 61.2 in *Human Development*, ranking 18th on the continent, which is both the country's highest score and rank within any of the four categories. Gabon reaches a notable 14th place on the continent in issues of *Health*, scoring 78.6, while its lowest sub-category score of *Human Development* is in *Education*, scoring 52.2.

Gabon shows broad-based improvements within two components of *Human Development*. The country achieves gains at the category level of +0.8 points, as a result of an uptick in both *Education* and *Health* by the same magnitude (+1.2). There is no change in score registered within the measures of *Welfare*.

Some of the most improved indicators include Antiretroviral Treatment (ART) Provision (+27.5) and Education System Quality (+6.2), but the country shows gains in six further indicators across both Education and Health. Gabon only shows deterioration in one indicator within Human Development: Public Health Campaigns (-25.0).


