

All figures have been rounded to the nearest one decimal place. This means that countries may appear to have the same score, or the change over time may appear inaccurate, but this is not the case when all decimal places are taken into account. Countries have been ranked and trends have been described on the basis of full scores not the rounded numbers that appear here.

Regional Economic Community (REC) averages are calculated by applying the REC's current membership configuration for all data years.

The Mo Ibrahim Foundation (MIF) is aware that some sources update their data sets after our documentation is sent to print. IIAG raw data are correct as per the date 'last accessed', which is stated for each indicator within the Data Portal (www.moibrahimfoundation.org/iiag/downloads/).

South Sudan and Sudan are excluded from all group averages pre-2011 as neither country existed in their current configurations before the secession of South Sudan in 2011.



The Ibrahim Index of African Governance (IIAG) measures the quality of governance in every African country on an annual basis. It does this by compiling data from diverse global sources to build an accurate and detailed picture of governance performance in African countries.

The broad aim of the IIAG is to better inform and sustain the debate on African governance by providing a transparent and user-friendly resource to:

 support citizens, governments, institutions and the private sector to accurately assess the delivery of public goods and services, and policy outcomes.

- encourage data-driven narratives on governance issues.
- help determine, debate and strengthen government performance.

The IIAG was created in 2007 in recognition of the need for a quantifiable tool to accurately measure and monitor African governance performance, its progress over time and across countries, and as a means of supporting effective and responsive solutions to complex public policy challenges in developing countries. Policies need to be evaluated by their results, which can only be done if accompanied by robust data.

NIGER

Niger's governance performance is a story of two halves; continued progress in its highest performing categories *Participation & Human Rights* and *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* contrasting with deterioration in its weakest categories *Safety & Rule of Law* and *Human Development*.

Improved scores in *Rights* and *Gender* have driven Niger's strengthening performance in *Participation* & *Human Rights*, despite a downward trend in *Participation*.

While impressive strides forward in *Infrastructure* have powered Niger's improvement in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity*, it shows weakness in the three other sub-categories.

Niger's deterioration in *Safety & Rule of Law* is considerable; it shows year-on-year deterioration and sweeping declines in *Rule of Law* and *National Security*, falling to the second lowest scoring country in West Africa in the latter sub-category, after Mali.

As the lowest ranking country in West Africa in *Human Development*, Niger demonstrates decline in this category. While minimal, this is driven by weakened scores in *Health*.

Overall governance: faltering performance.

Niger scores 48.4 (out of 100) in overall governance, ranking 33rd (out of 54) in Africa.

Niger shows overall governance deterioration (-0.6) since 2011.

Niger scores lower than the African average and lower than the regional average for West Africa.

Niger is ranked 10th in West Africa in overall governance.

Safety & Rule of Law: dramatic decline in National Security.

Niger scores 51.5 in Safety & Rule of Law, ranking 31st on the continent.

Within the Safety & Rule of Law category, Niger's best sub-category performance is in National Security, scoring 63.1.

Niger's weakest sub-category performance in the Safety & Rule of Law category is in Accountability, scoring 40.5.

Niger has shown a deterioration (-5.1) in *Safety & Rule of Law* since 2011. This has been driven by deterioration in three of the four sub-categories: *Rule of Law* (-9.1), *Accountability* (-2.7) and *National Security* (-11.7).

Participation & Human Rights: highest scoring category exhibits positive trend.

Niger scores 56.8 in *Participation & Human Rights*, ranking 20th on the continent.

Within the *Participation & Human Rights* category, Niger's best sub-category performance is in *Participation*, scoring 68.2.

Niger's weakest sub-category performance in the *Participation & Human Rights category* is in *Gender*, scoring 38.8.

Niger has shown an improvement (+1.4) in *Participation & Human Rights* since 2011. This has been driven by improvement in two of the three sub-categories: *Rights* (+2.2) and *Gender* (+4.3).

Sustainable Economic Opportunity: progress in Infrastructure powers category-level improvement.

Niger scores 42.3 in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity*, ranking 29th on the continent.

Within the *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* category, Niger's best sub-category performance is in *Rural Sector*, scoring 49.5.

Niger's weakest sub-category performance in the *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* category is in *Infrastructure*, scoring 21.6.

Niger has shown an improvement (+1.7) in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* since 2011. This has been driven by improvement in one of the four sub-categories: *Infrastructure* (+10.7).

Human Development: weakening performance in Niger's lowest scoring category.

Niger scores 43.1 in *Human Development*, ranking 49th on the continent.

Within the *Human Development* category, Niger's best sub-category performance is in *Health*, scoring 57.7.

Niger's weakest sub-category performance in the *Human Development* category is in *Education*, scoring 23.6.

Niger has shown a deterioration (-0.3) in *Human Development* since 2011. This has been driven by deterioration in two of the three sub-categories: *Education* (-0.6) and *Health* (-1.6).


